

GI RESEARCH FOUNDATION MISSION + HISTORY

The GI Research Foundation is a non-profit 501(c)3 dedicated to raise funds to support the physicians and scientists at the University of Chicago Medicine Digestive Diseases Center and their efforts to provide outstanding care, train future leaders and perform innovative clinical and laboratory research in order to treat, cure, and prevent digestive diseases.

What is GIRF?

GIRF is the Gastro Intestinal Research Foundation of Chicago oriented to the University of Chicago. GIRF is a group of people from all walks of life; many are patients, all are friends, united in a common effort to support research on the cause and cure of digestive diseases. GIRF provides funds for equipment, laboratories and the support of investigators and young physicians to the University of Chicago Gastroenterology Section, a group of dedicated doctors who seek solutions to all kinds of gastrointestinal illnesses, affecting the esophagus, the stomach, the small intestine, the large intestine, the liver, the gallbladder, and the pancreas. GIRF is an organization without politics and without bias. Everyone with a similar interest and capacity to contribute is welcome to join.

What is GIRF? GIRF, above all, is a unique blend of wonderful, kind and generous men and women giving of themselves and their resources, whose greatest reward is that inner sense of satisfaction and goodness that comes from helping Dr. Joseph Kirsner and his colleagues at the University of Chicago and, through them, helping humanity everywhere.

Joseph B. Kirsner, MD, PhD University of Chicago, Circa 1975 Approximately 70 million Americans live with a digestive disease. Since 1961, the GI Research Foundation has partnered with the University of Chicago Medicine to transform their lives.

Sixty years ago, the GI Research Foundation was founded by grateful patients of Dr. Joseph B. Kirsner, a pioneer in gastroenterology who devoted his life to medicine, teaching and patient care. Today, the UChicago Medicine Digestive Diseases Center is internationally recognized for research-driven medicine and highly specialized physicians. Inspired by Dr. Kirsner's vision, the GI Research Foundation helps ensure the UChicago Medicine Digestive Diseases Center remains at the forefront of innovation and collaborative care.

GI RESEARCH FOUNDATION TIMELINE

In **1961**, two Chicago businessmen, Martin N. Sandler and Joseph E. Valenti, Sr., joined Dr. Joseph B. Kirsner in establishing the Gastro Intestinal Research Foundation.

In **1963**, GIRF hosted their inaugural dinner honoring Joseph B. Kirsner.

By the spring of **1964**, GIRF grew to over 325 members and increased their marketing presence within the clinic with the publication of the GIRF newsletter. In August of **1964**, GIRF launched a Women's Division, which established unique fundraising events including the annual spring fashion show, greeting cards, and the publication of a GIRF cookbook, which was designed to help diversify the dull dietary routine of patients on a lengthy program of recovery. The GIRF cookbook sold 5,500 copies within the first two months and went into a second printing.

During the winter of **1965**, GIRF initiated an "equipment program," which identified 27 important pieces of medical research equipment that could be purchased by individual members. First announced in **1968**, the Center for the Study of Digestive Diseases at the University of Chicago was established as a result of GIRF's efforts.

In the **1980s**, through a partnership between GIRF and the University of Chicago, the construction of the Joseph B. Kirsner Center at the University of Chicago was completed.

In the **mid-1980s**, GIRF contributed \$500,000 over a three-year period to develop a new research program on the biology of the intestinal epithelium called The Cell-Tech Research Program. Ö

In the **1990s**, GIRF established a research facility to investigate the scientific aspects of Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis.

In the **1990s**, the Associates Board began raising seed money to support projects initiated by fellows just starting their careers in digestive diseases research.

In the fall of **1996**, GIRF accepted the challenge of developing a research program on the genetics of inflammatory bowel disease. As a result of the money raised by GIRF and other contributors, the first gastroenterology DNA research lab was established. This lab is where the first gene known to be responsible for Crohn's disease was discovered. In the **2000s**, GIRF raised over \$7 million dollars for equipment and laboratories to further GI research.

In **2013**, UChicago Medicine Center for Discovery and Care opened. The new hospital includes a dedicated inpatient unit for IBD patients, one of the only of its kind in the world, funded, in part, by GIRF. In **2016**, the GI Research Foundation began supporting the University of Chicago Medicine Microbiome Medicine Initiative to discover new therapies and treatment paradigms for digestive diseases, including microbiota transfer.

In **2020**, during the height of the global pandemic, GIRF raised over \$60,000 of emergency funding for healthcare workers at UChicago Medicine and over \$1.4 million at its first Virtual Ball.

JOSEPH B. KIRSNER AWARD

The GI Research Foundation is privileged to present an annual tradition of honoring Joseph B. Kirsner, MD, PhD and his legacy of advancements in research, training, and patient care. The Joseph B. Kirsner Award recognizes those who have made a substantial commitment to further and impact the GI Research Foundation's mission. We are thrilled to present Beatrice G. Crain of the Crain-Maling Foundation with the inaugural award at GIRF's Diamond Anniversary Ball.

Joseph B. Kirsner, MD, PhD was a renowned physician, educator, and scientist at the University of Chicago. For more than seven decades, Dr. Kirsner devoted his life to medicine, teaching, and patient care. In recognition of his impact, he received two Lifetime Achievement Awards from the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation, the Julius Friedenwald Medal from the American Gastroenterological Association, and the Rudolf V. Schindler Award from the American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy. His dedication to the University, and his leadership in the field, helped establish the University of Chicago Medicine as an authority in digestive diseases.

Chairman of the Crain-Maling Foundation and lifelong philanthropist, Beatrice "Bee" G. Crain has spent years supporting and honoring her dear friend Dr. Joseph B. Kirsner's vision of linking innovation with patient care. Bee's husband met Dr. Kirsner while serving in WWII. After the war, their friendship continued, with Bee and her husband stepping up as leaders from GIRF's first years. Over the decades, Bee has supported efforts that led to scientific breakthroughs like the discovery of the first gene associated with Crohn's disease (NOD2), supported facilities development, including the establishment of several GI and immunological laboratories and the creation of the Joseph B. Kirsner Center at the University of Chicago Medicine, and funded equipment programs for critical translational research at the University of Chicago Medicine Digestive Diseases Center.

On this milestone occasion, the GI Research Foundation is proud to honor Beatrice G. Crain with the inaugural Joseph B. Kirsner Award.






